The **Maya World** Extension is a two-night / three-day inland adventure to Crooked Tree Wildlife Sanctuary, home to some of Belize's best birding and wildlife viewing. Explore Crooked Tree lagoons by boat – an excellent opportunity to northern jacanas, white ibis, wood storks and the giant jabiru stork, among others. Visit Crooked Tree Village, one of Belize's oldest Creole settlements. Tour the ancient city of Lamanai, returning by boat along the intriguing New River lagoon, with opportunities to spot monkeys, parrots, toucans and Morelet's Crocodiles. Journey to the Mayan ruin of Altun Ha, known for the impressive temple of the Sun God. This extension combines seamlessly with other IE trips and is considered an exceptional area for birding and wildlife.

Typical Daily Itinerary:

Day 1: A driver will pick you up at the airport or in Belize City and take you to Birds Eye View Lodge, approximately 30 minutes north, in the heart of the Crooked Tree Wildlife Sanctuary. After checking into your accommodations, we meet for dinner. This evening, explore the nearby Creole village of Crooked Tree (the local name of the cashew tree).

Accommodation: Bird's Eye View Lodge

Meals: Dinner

Day 2: After breakfast, your group departs for the ancient Mayan city of Lamanai. We travel by vehicle, north towards the town of Orange Walk, and stop on the banks of the New River to board our waiting motor boat. A guided boat tour down the narrow waterways, full of wildlife, brings us to the New River Lagoon, with the ruins of Lamanai on it's shore. You'll go on an extensive guided tour, visiting the many temples, plazas, palaces, and museums within the park. After lunch, we continue deeper into the abandoned colonial sugar mill. We return from Lamanai on this scenic boat ride, spotting innumerable birds, iguanas, parrots, monkey, toucans and even Morelet's crocodiles along the river banks. We return to the lodge to toast the sunset and a well earned dinner.

Accommodation: Bird's Eye View Lodge

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 3: With an early morning coffee and binoculars in hand, enjoy the waking wilderness and hundreds of birds feeding along the shores of the Crooked Tree Lagoons. Created in 1984, the sanctuary was primarily established to preserve a network of inland lagoons, swamps, and waterways that shelter a huge population of resident and migratory birds, including the jabiru stork. After breakfast, enjoy a morning boat birding tour of the lagoons to add species to your bird list.

After lunch, you'll have time to relax and gather your bags before departing for the Mayan site of Altun Ha. Altun Ha dates back to 600 BC, where it functioned as an important ceremonial and trading center between the interior and central Maya people, during the classic period (250-900 AD). Within this site are the remains of more than 275 archaeological structures and 250 to 300 unexcavated mounds.

All itineraries are subject to change depending on weather and safety considerations.

You'll return to the Belize City at approximately 4 p.m. All other guests will be dropped off at the Belize International Airport or the Belize Biltmore Plaza (in Belize City) to continue with your IE trip, or independent arrangements.
