Overview:

Journey to the least populated of Belize's 3 atolls - **Glover's Reef**. Located 36 miles offshore, this area is part of a UNESCO World Heritage site and offers unparalleled paddling and some of the healthiest coral in the entire Caribbean. You'll stay at our basecamp on **Southwest Caye** where you'll enjoy a flexible daily schedule of guided reef adventures for all skill-levels.

Basecamping: Our spacious safari-style tents are on raised wooden floors, have ample headroom to walk around, and are equipped with wood-framed beds (6-inch foam mattresses). Tents can be configured with either double or single beds. All bed linen is provided.

Glover's Reef Atoll: At approx. 20 miles long and 8 miles wide, Glover's Reef is home to over 800 coral patch reefs. 5 coral islands are semi-protected along the atoll's Southeast crest - providing excellent kayaking and SUP opportunities for both beginner and experienced paddlers.

Southwest Caye: A remote 13-acre private tropical island surrounded by over 17,000 acres of marine protected waters including mangrove areas, intertidal zones, sea grass beds, and coral reefs.

Typical Daily Itinerary:

Day 1: We meet at 7:30AM for an 8:00AM private boat charter to Glover's Reef. You'll travel beyond the Mesoamerican Barrier Reef System to our private basecamp on Southwest Caye. The distance travelled is approx. 36 miles and takes 1.5 hours. Upon arrival, your guides will introduce you to your new island home where you'll have time to settle into your tent cabana. The rest of the day will be spent on the water where you'll receive professional instruction and introductions to tropical kayaking and snorkeling. In the afternoon enjoy either a guided paddle or shallow-water snorkel at a local patch reef.

Accommodation: Glover's Basecamp

Meals: Lunch, Dinner

Days 2 & 3: Start your day with an early swim or grab a mat and practice sunrise yoga by the beach. Over the coming days, an array of guided activities will be offered based on weather conditions and group interest. This is your opportunity to learn from the locals before venturing off on your own! We also host informative sessions on Belize, the marine environment, and local culture. All guided sessions are optional and laying in a hammock is considered an "official activity". Evenings on Southwest Caye are filled with happy hour gatherings, cold beverages, night walks, beach games, star gazing, cultural presentations, and incredible Caribbean sunsets.

Accommodation: Glover's Basecamp

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 4: Choose your own adventure for your last morning on Glover's Reef! Grab a mask, snorkel, and fins for a final visit to your favourite coral reef spot or fly fish on the flats. Our boat returns to the dock in Dangriga in for early afternoon.

Accommodation: None

Meals: Breakfast, lunch

Travel Notes: Because of the early morning check-in time, we suggest arriving in Dangriga the day before and confirming morning boat logistics with our staff prior to meeting up.
